The focus of this role includes:

- **Knowledge Strategy Development:** Establishing and maintaining a robust knowledge management framework tailored to the unique challenges of urban plastic waste management. This involves aligning the framework with global standards, donor expectations, and the overarching goals of the Plastic Smart Cities initiative.
- **Data-Driven Insights:** Supporting cities to adopt sustainable practices by collecting, analyzing, and synthesizing quantitative and qualitative data related to plastic pollution, waste flows, and circular economy models. Insights generated will guide project implementation and support advocacy efforts for policy change.
- **Promoting Collaboration and Learning:** Acting as a knowledge bridge among various stakeholders, including municipal governments, community organizations, private sector actors, and international partners. This entails fostering a culture of learning and collaboration by sharing actionable knowledge products such as toolkits, case studies, success stories, and guidelines.
- **Capacity Building:** Equipping city-level teams, partners, and stakeholders with the tools, methodologies, and skills needed to implement and scale effective waste reduction strategies. This includes conducting workshops, developing training modules, and facilitating peer-to-peer learning opportunities.
- **Scaling Impact Through Innovation:** Identifying and promoting innovative practices and technologies that cities can adopt to minimize plastic waste. The Knowledge Management Specialist will also evaluate the scalability and replicability of solutions, ensuring knowledge is packaged and disseminated for broad impact.

By driving a cohesive and well-structured knowledge management approach, this position ensures that the Plastic Smart Cities Project serves as a global model for sustainable urban development and accelerates the transition toward a circular economy.

- Build the capacity of municipal authorities, NGOs, and local communities to adopt data-driven approaches to plastic waste management.
- Facilitate knowledge sharing and collaboration among participating cities, project partners, and external stakeholders.
- Maintain partnerships with government bodies, academia, private sector actors, and NGOs to foster collective action on plastic waste reduction.

- Prepare and disseminate regular knowledge products such as case studies, best practice reports, and dashboards that highlight the project's progress.
- Ensure accurate and timely documentation of project achievements, lessons learned, and innovations.
- Develop tailored reports for various audiences, including donors, government agencies, community organizations, and internal teams. Ensure reports meet specific requirements and include actionable insights
- Maintain a consistent reporting schedule to keep all stakeholders informed of the project's progress and impact.
- Update a centralized digital repository where all project-related documents, reports, and tools are stored.
- Use multiple channels (e.g., workshops, webinars, publications, online platforms) to share knowledge products widely among stakeholders.
- Review and validate all documentation to ensure accuracy, completeness, and compliance with donor and organizational standards.
- Working close collaboration with PSC project team for project data collection including numerical, social, and policy data as well as developing the knowledge products
